# Our Program

## What would you do if you were forced to choose between fixing your teeth and putting food on the table?

For too many Californians, this is the stark reality. As the cost-of-living crisis continues to spiral out of control, dentistry and optometry are increasingly treated as a luxury that few low-income individuals can afford. Families are forced to delay or forego treatment in favor of the bare essentials. We break down barriers to care by offering care with no costs and as little paperwork as possible, treating healthcare as a right, rather than an afterthought.



## How We Work



We partner with other non-profits and community groups to provide the free, quality dental, medical, and vision services their clients so desperately need. We leverage pre-existing relationships and connections to reach those in need.



We never charge our patients or partners for care. We don't seek reimbursement from insurance or the government. We rely on individual and institutional donations to fund our work. We recruit volunteer professionals to provide care at our clinics



Healing California brings treatment straight to patients at veteran stand downs, community health events and now with our mobile van – communities throughout the state. Our commitment to serving rural areas further lowers barriers to care.



We partner with local FQHC's, community clinics, and Medi-Cal providers to ensure continuity of care and follow-up treatments for patients.

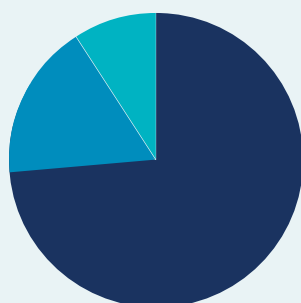
