Our Program

We all know the fear and exhaustion that comes with being in pain. Or the anxiety and self-doubt that overtakes us when life is out of focus. Some of us have the networks and resources to alleviate our pain and improve our quality of life. Others face ever growing hurdles to quality care.

Sadly, there are more and more barriers to quality care that are plaguing the lives of Californians. Inflation and the rising cost of living forces many to choose paying their rent and putting food on the table over preventative dental and vision care. Dwindling numbers of dental and vision care practices in rural areas means more people are suffering unnecessarily when an emergency arises. The high costs of dental and vision insurance and limited public options leave people unsure of what to do. Housing instability can make follow up care a challenge.

Healing California knocks down all these barriers and removes fear and stress at a time when people are already overwhelmed and in need of a helping hand, not more paperwork.



How We Work



We partner with other non-profits and community groups to provide the free, quality dental, medical, and vision services their clients so desperately need. We leverage pre-existing relationships and connections to reach those in need.



We never charge our patients or partners for care. We don't seek reimbursement from insurance or the government. We rely on individual and institutional donations to fund our work. We recruit volunteer professionals to provide care at our clinics



Healing California brings treatment straight to patients at veteran stand downs, community health events and now with our mobile van – communities throughout the state. Our commitment to serving rural areas further lowers barriers to care.



We partner with local FQHC's, community clinics, and Medi-Cal providers to ensure continuity of care and follow-up treatments for patients.
